Building Awesome Whānau (BAW)

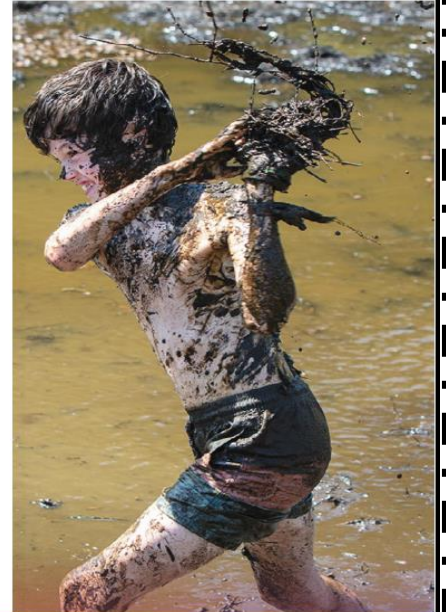


kaupapa whānau – thriving children, flourishing families
