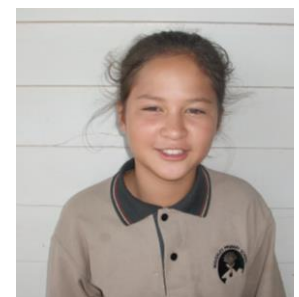

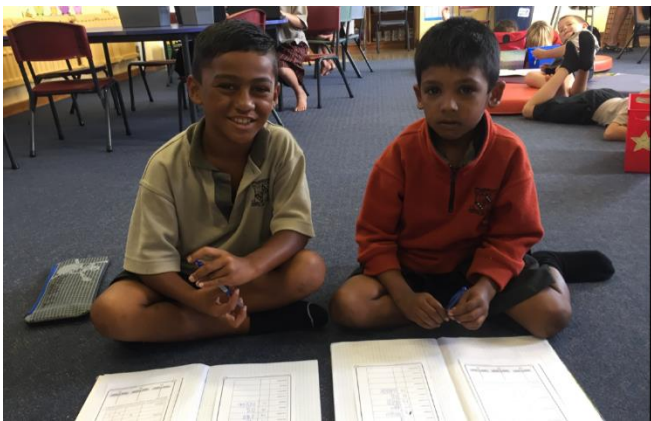

Some parents have been concerned there are no consequences in our school. So today we will be sharing with you what a consequence is in our school and what they actually are.

What is a consequence?

A consequence is something that happens as a response of an action, etc. if you forget to bring your hat to school, your consequence will be to sit in the shade at break times. There are lots of different consequences, for example – completing a behaviour reflection sheet during break times, being removed from class or break, parents contacted, doing a speech, making a poster and much more.
